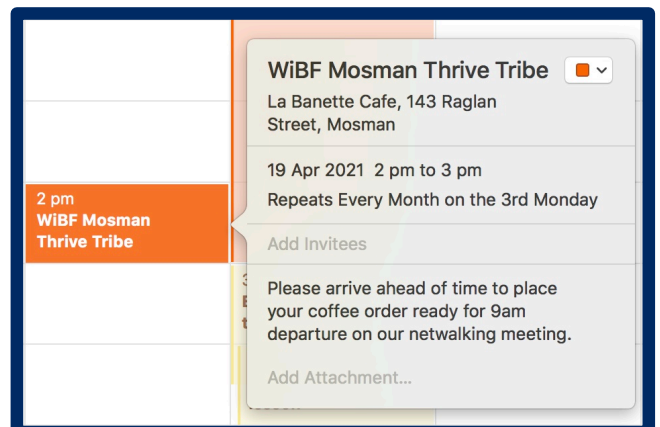
THRIVE TRIBE LEADER GUIDE

COVID19 has changed how and where we work and connect. More than ever before, WiBF is here to support our members to thrive in their work and life. That's why we're encouraging our members – across Australia's cities, suburbs and regional areas – to connect and build their own local Thrive tribe.

The concept is simple – small groups, meeting regularly, in a COVID-safe context to offer friendship and support in your own backyard.

For those interested in leading a Thrive Tribe, the process is simple:

1. Decide where and when you would like to arrange your Thrive tribe meet up – this could be a coffee or lunch in a local coffee shop, a walk and talk, drinks after work, a pilates class, book club, trivia night... whatever takes your fancy! We suggest keeping it simple and COVID-safe by limiting numbers and perhaps meeting outdoors or in public spaces. If you're working from the office you could meet somewhere near there, or else closer to home if you're WFH. We suggest a regular meeting slot, such as a set day and time each month.
2. Contact the WiBF office on mail@wibf.org.au and share your ideas and email or LinkedIn profile URL – we'll add this to the WiBF webpage www.wibf.org.au/thrive-tribes as a means for members to contact you directly. You can publish your email address, or for added privacy and security LinkedIn messaging can be used for initial expressions of interest. Refer the Thrive web page for details of what we will publish – published information will be kept brief and you can advise the venue or meeting place to interested participants once they make contact.
3. Set up a calendar invitation in your own calendar with the recurring timing, and invite those people who wish to join your tribe. This screen grab is an example to help. You may also use a WhatsApp or Messenger group to manage group communications – whatever works for you!
4. WiBF will promote your Thrive Tribe and encourage WiBF members to contact you to express interest in joining.
5. Finally, stay in touch with us and let us know how your tribe is growing. We encourage you to share your meet up photos and stories on social media with #WiBFThriveTribe to encourage other members to jump on board!
